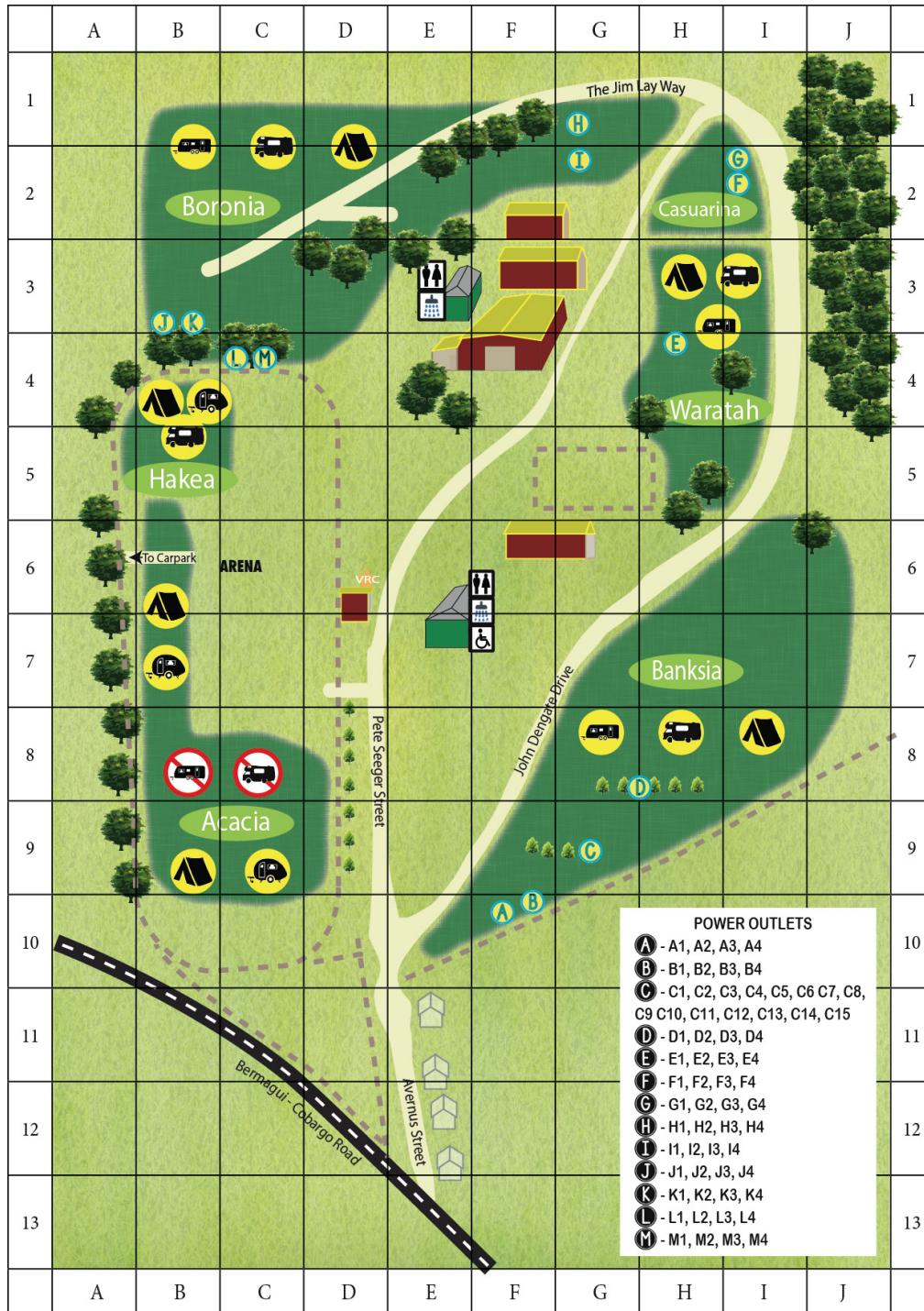


# Cobargo Showground Camping Areas



## Cobargo Folk Festival Camping Guide

CAMPING AREAS	
Campers should note that the Cobargo Showground site can be quite steep in parts. Some areas defined for camping may not be suitable for any type of camping. Sites are allocated on a first-in-first-served basis.	
Acacia camping area	No access for large caravans and RVs over 7 metres. Smaller camper trailers and tents permitted. No access to power.
Hakea camping area	Reserved for CFF committee, performers and volunteers. Unrestricted access for all types of camping. No public access. Limited access to power.
Boronia camping area	Unrestricted access for all types of camping. Preferred area for RVs and caravans over 7 metres. Up to 16 powered sites available.
Casuarina camping area	Unrestricted access for all types of camping. Up to 16 powered sites available.
Waratah camping area	Unrestricted access for all types of camping. 4 powered sites available.
Banksia camping area	Unrestricted access for all types of camping. Preferred area for RVs and caravans over 7 metres. Up to 27 powered sites available.

## COBARGO FOLK FESTIVAL - ONSITE CAMPING 2019

Campers are reminded that by entering the Festival site they are agreeing to the Ticket Purchase and Event Attendance Terms and Conditions available on our website.

### New Arrangements for 2019

Campers should be aware of the following changes to camping arrangements at the 2019 Festival:

1. Caravans and RVs over 7m will not be allowed in the Acacia camping area. Suitable sites can be found in the Boronia and Banksia or Casuarina and Waratah camping areas, depending on availability.
2. The Hakea camping areas is reserved for volunteers, performers and VIPs.
2. Anyone requiring power is advised to PRE-BOOK when purchasing tickets (a \$45 fee applies) as powered sites are limited and cannot be guaranteed at the gate
3. When booking power, you will be asked to nominate your preferred outlet - see map for reference information. Power is allocated on a first-in-first-served basis

### General Camping Requirements

- Camping fees must be paid before you can enter the showground.
- Camping is sold on a per person basis
- Camping is for weekend ticket holders only. A free day car parking area is available for non-campers.
- Campers' vehicles must have a Vehicle Pass displayed at all times.
- All campers must be respectful and considerate of their neighbours and the environment.
- Campers under 18 must be accompanied and supervised by a responsible adult camper (Guardian) over the age of 25 and are subject to the Festival Youth policy (see website for details)
- Camper vans, caravans, self-contained motor homes are welcome and must be positioned in designated areas. You will be directed to these on arrival – please ensure that you do not block roads, pathways or other access points. Please assist our volunteers by following directions given by them.

- Caravans and RVs over 7m will not be allowed in the Acacia camping area. Suitable sites can be found in the Boronia, Banksia, Casuarina and Waratah camping areas, depending on availability.
- The Acacia camping areas is reserved for tents, smaller campervans and camper trailers.
- No campfires under any circumstances.
- One powered site, one user. It is the responsibility of the person who purchased the powered site to ensure no piggybacking of power leads. Sites will be inspected during the Festival and piggybacked boards and leads will be removed. Offenders will be asked to move to non-powered sites.
- The organisers do not accept responsibility for the consequences of any power failures or disconnection. Continuing misuse of powered sites may lead to the complete closure of all powered sites for subsequent festivals.
- Please be considerate about generator use.
- Please conserve water – especially hot water – by limiting your shower time and checking that taps are not left running or dripping.
- No pets – guide dogs and assistance animals excepted.
- Gas bottles must have a CURRENT inspection tag and maintained in accordance with Australian Standard 2030. Do not leave any gas appliances on and unattended.
- Please be courteous of other campers and keep noise levels down at the camping sites.
- The Arena Gate from Pete Seeger Street will be closed to vehicle access Friday morning, and reopened at 3:00pm Sunday.
- Please be considerate and allow space for other campers.

### Waste Management

- Campers will be provided with 3 compostable bags to help sort waste into organics, recyclables and general rubbish. Please assist our volunteers by sorting your rubbish at your campsite before disposing of it in the bins provided.
- Portable toilets must NOT be emptied anywhere on site. There is a dump point at the Cobargo Hotel.
