



CAMPING AT THE 2025
COBARGO
FOLK FESTIVAL

Camping at our Festival creates a great sense of community and has become a village for folk music enthusiasts. Even if you are a seasoned festival camper, or a first timer to our event, we want to make you aware of some guidelines to enhance your experience and those of your neighbours.

No alcohol and no glass is to be brought onto the Festival site.

People will be directed to leave the site immediately if they bring alcohol not purchased at the bar and glass into the Entertainment Zone and into venues. Alcohol purchased at the bar cannot be taken outside the Licensed area.

No entry allowed into the Festival site until 10:00am Thursday and campsites need to be vacated by 10:00am on Monday.

If you are planning to arrive prior to Thursday, you will need to organise other facilities in the area.

Campers are reminded that by entering the Festival site, they are agreeing to the Ticket Purchase and Event Attendance Terms and Conditions which are available on our website.

General Camping Guidelines

- Showground Camping is only available to weekend ticket holders and must be pre-purchased online. There is no single night camping option.
- Campers' vehicles must have a Vehicle Pass displayed at all times.
- We request that only one vehicle per caravan be parked within the Arena Camping area.
- **No pets – accredited assistance animals excepted. People with non-accredited assistance animals will be asked to leave.**

- All campers must be respectful and considerate of their neighbours and the environment.
- Campers under 18 must be accompanied and supervised by a responsible adult camper (Guardian) over the age of 25 and are subject to the Festival Youth policy (see website for details).
- This is a folk music festival. If you are likely to be disturbed by people sessioning into the early hours of the morning and starting up early the next day, please do not camp on-site but take advantage of the many local caravan and camping areas in the Bega Valley.
- Please ensure that you do not block roads, pathways or other access points. Please assist our volunteers by following their directions.
- No campfires under any circumstances.
- Generators are NOT permitted.
- Please conserve water – especially hot water – by limiting your shower time and checking that taps are not left running or dripping.
- Gas bottles must be maintained in accordance with Australian Standard 2030. Do not leave any gas appliances on and unattended.
- Please be courteous of other campers and keep noise levels down at the camping sites.
- Please be considerate and allow space for other campers.
- No Glass - cattle and horses graze this Showground so NO GLASS please, including in the Entertainment Zone.

Waste Management

We aim to deliver a Zero Landfill event, bins are clearly marked for appropriate disposal, of your waste, our volunteers will be present to assist.

- Campers will be provided with 3 compostable bags to help sort waste into FOGO, recyclables and general rubbish. Please assist our volunteers by sorting your rubbish at your campsite before disposing of it in the bins provided. We kindly ask you to take general rubbish home with you.
- Portable toilets must NOT be emptied anywhere on site. There is a dump point at the Cobargo Hotel.

CAMPING AREAS – COBARGO SHOWGROUND

The Arena:

This is the spot if you want to have the full immersive experience that the Cobargo Folk Festival is famous for. A flat area located close to all venues and facilities suitable for small caravans, camper tailers, campervans, tents and car camping. The only restriction on the Arena is The Arena Gates will be closed to vehicle access from midday Friday, and reopened at 3:00pm Sunday. Those who plan to leave the Festival during these times should move their vehicle to the Day Car Park. We also have the Lower Arena Camping area available, great for those who have high clearance caravans and vehicles.

Banksia Camping:

We have a number of areas within Banksia that accommodate all styles of camping. If you have a larger caravan or motorhome, Banksia 1,2 and 3 is the place to head. This area ranges from flat to gently sloping, with good access and close to all amenities. Our regular campers call this the Festival Village as it is a social area and is suitable for camping groups. Banksia 4 is on a slightly sloping land so is more appropriate to tents, roof top tents and small campers.

Waratah Camping and Casuarina Camping:

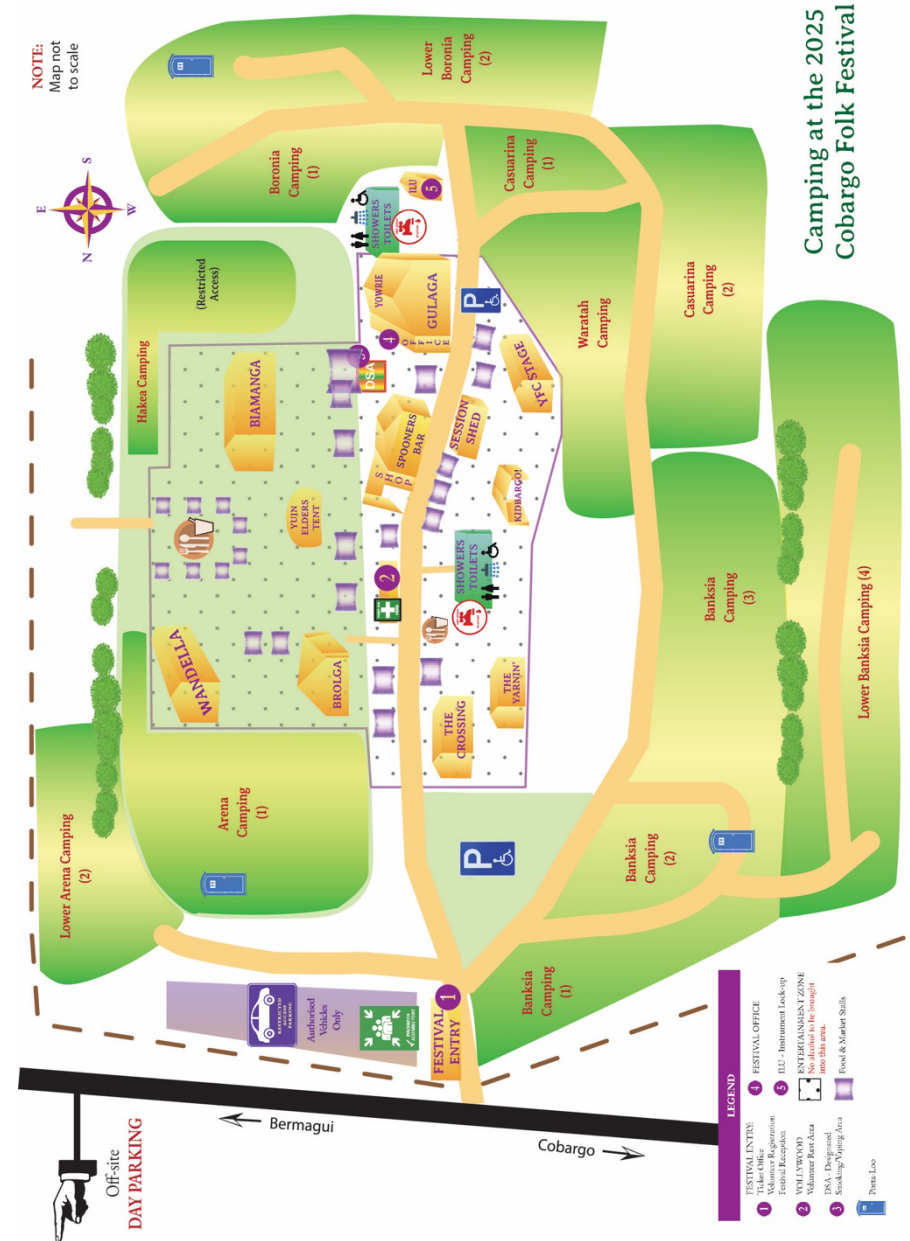
These two areas are open to all styles of camping, they have mostly flat land and are close to all venues and facilities. These spaces follow the roadway so it is very friendly to reversing your towable vehicle.

Boronia Camping:

Boronia is spread over three areas. This is a quieter area at the southern end of the showground. There is a small flat space just below the Arena suitable for any towable vehicle, and all other styles of camping. Further along the road you will find Lower Boronia which is ideal for high clearance caravans, campers and tents. This has free form camping so is popular with those who want to camp in a group. The lower area is not suitable for large motorhomes or caravans.

Hakea Camping:

This area is reserved for our wonderful performers.
